

CHAPTER 10

YARD AND GARAGE SALES

SECTION:

3-10-1: RESTRICTIONS: No person, firm or corporation shall sponsor or conduct an auction, yard or garage sale at a property zoned residential more than two (2) times per year. The duration of any residential auction, yard or garage sale shall not be more than seventy-two (72) continuous hours.

3-10-2: PERMIT REQUIRED: No person, firm or corporation shall conduct an auction, yard or garage sale without first obtaining a permit therefore from the Village Clerk. Application for such permits shall be made in writing to the Village Clerk and shall state the date, time and address of the proposed sale and the name of the person, firm or corporation responsible for the sale activity.

3-10-3: ISSUANCE OF PERMIT: Upon receipt of application for an auction, yard or garage sale permit, such investigation as shall be deemed necessary in regard thereto shall be made. If the Village Clerk is satisfied that the proposed sale is within the provisions of this article, a permit shall be issued. The permit shall be non-transferable and displayed in a prominent place at the premises of the sale. If an application is rejected, it may be appealed to the Board of Trustees.

3-10-4: POWER TO REVOKE: The Chief of Police shall have the power to revoke any permit that may have been granted as herein provided. A revocation of permit may be appealed to the Board of Trustees.

3-10-5: PENALTIES: Whoever violates any provisions of this article shall, except as otherwise provided, be fined not more than two-hundred dollars (\$200.00). Each day's violation shall constitute a separate offense.
